## Follow-up to the United Nations Conference on the World Financial and Economic Crisis and its Impact on Development

Decision in the outcome document <sup>1</sup>	Follow-up activities of ECOSOC and/or the General Assembly	Next steps
Paragraph 54  We invite the General Assembly to establish an ad hoc openended working group of the General Assembly to follow up on the issues contained in the present outcome document, and to submit a report on the progress of its work to the General Assembly before the end of the sixty-fourth session.	On 16 July 2009 a draft resolution <sup>2</sup> was circulated by the President of the General Assembly, H.E. Mr. Miguel d'Escoto Brockmann, to establish immediately an ad hoc open-ended working group of the General Assembly to follow up on the issues contained in the outcome of the conference.  The President of the General Assembly called a meeting of the General Assembly on 31 July to take action on the draft resolution. <sup>3</sup> On 31 July the General Assembly decided to establish an ad hoc open-ended working group to follow up on issues described in the outcome document of the conference on the impact of the world financial and economic crisis on development (GA Resolution 63/305 <sup>4</sup> ). The working group was originally expected to meet from 24 July 2009 to 13 September 2010, for a total of 16 meetings four during the sixty-third session and 12 in the sixty-fourth. <sup>5</sup> Co-chairs of the ad hoc open-ended working	The ad hoc openended working group must submit a report on the progress of its work to the General Assembly before the end of the sixty-fourth session (as requested by the General Assembly in Resolution 63/305). Paragraph 56(b)  We request the Economic and Social Council to:  Make recommendations to the General Assembly, in accordance with the Doha Declaration of 2 December 2008, for a strengthened and more effective and inclusive intergovernmental process to carry out the financing for development follow-up;	During the meeting on 31 July, ECOSOC adopted the decision for a strengthened and more effective intergovernmental inclusive process to carry out the financing for development follow-up.  By passing the resolution E/2009/36, the Council decided to upgrade its High-level Spring Meeting with the international financial and trade institutions by extending its duration and holding it well in advance of the annual Spring Meetings of the Bretton Woods institutions (BWIs) at an appropriate timing, at least five weeks before those meetings, and in a manner that is "conducive to high-level participation" (as opposed to the current practice of holding it after the Bretton Woods institution's Spring Meeting). The new framework therefore increases the chances of positively influencing ministerial debates within the international financial institutions in the future. The resolution also lays the ground for increasing the prominence of financing for development (FfD) issues at ECOSOC and in the General Assembly.
